- A. Introduction of New Team Members
 - a. Update new staff positions.
 - b. Jim and Ponse joined the team as part time drivers.
 - c. Jim Richards retired Navy
 - d. Ponse: Actively in the reserves as a staff sergeant. Owns a small gym by Joliet Junior College
 - e. Amy is Assistant Superintendent
 - f. Eric is the certified VSO working on the higher level.
- B. Update NACVSO Leadership Summit Washington D.C. (April 6-10)
 - a. National organization that accredits us. Jen is the delegate for IL on the state level.
 - b. Opportunity for delegates to meet with representatives as well as bring issues to the group.
 - c. Focus on the disability memorial affairs. The disability would be tested against a means test.
- C. Update Veteran Legislative Summit Springfield, IL (March 19th)
 - a. This was put together by AMVETS
 - b. Discussed the proposed legislation. Opposed SB 2018, This was sponsored by Lake County.

Commissioners would be elected officials and not appointed by the post.

- c. SB 1368/HB1352 They want to combined counties to create a VAC. The funding would need to be determined along with how the commission would work. The VAC is for this bill with the amendments.

 - b. First Tuesday of the month will stagger and stay open till 7 PM. Starting in April. Will determine the need and adjust as needed.
- G. VA Claims Award Log
 - a. Q4 2024 ended with \$28.1
 - b. Q1 2025 seeing growth of \$4.8. The trends have been showing the overall impact is about 66%
 - c. The 32.9 million dollars impacts Will County since this is going to our veterans in the county.
 - d. 591 new veterans: December 1^{st} to 3/24
 - e. 278 new claims
 - f. 46 were higher level review claims.
 - g. 14 claims for burial
 - h. 2 claims for Pension
 - i. 315 for POA claims
 - j. Total interactions 6,166 (Phone calls, emails and fax)
- H. Financial Assistance
 - a. Provide \$5,232 in shelter assistance
 - b. Electricity \$749
 - c. Gas \$371
 - d. Water \$78
 - e. Only used 11% of the budget and need to work on getting awareness to the community about this program.
- I. Peer Support Recover Specialist Updates
 - a. The group meetings that are coordinated for substance abuse and mental health.
 - b. Housing Wednesday-Assisted 16 veterans to find housing. Including transitional housing as well as community shelters
 - c. Will County Court Support Mentor 36 veterans for therapeutic support groups.
- J. Mental Health Coordinator Updates
 - a. January 10 veterans that were successfully referred to VA for extended help
 - b. Strength after Service will be developed and started
 - c. Morning coffee meeting to start in May
 - d. Extended hours to help working veterans
 - e. Will County detention facility to help the veterans with their benefits and what will happen when get out

- f. Will County Community Health board grant was applied for. Help to get another vehicle as well as allow more money into these programs.
- g. There are a lot of veterans that do not qualify for the VA or the veterans do not have a good experience and will come in to see Sam.
- h. The support system for the veterans also need help at times so this helps to provide that service
- i. This also helps with not having to wait for an appointment if needed immediately.
- j. This would also help the cold era since they do not have benefits to go to the VA. This is a service they could utilize.
- K. Outreach Updates
 - a. Jeff is the newly appointed for outreach.
 - b. Multiple outreach events at various posts.
 - c. DuPage township does want the VAC to be there since it is helping in the area.
 - d. Teamed up with Allen Force to be at their office once a month to assist
 - e. Will also be at the Plainfield township once a month to assist
 - f. Receiving multiple emails for events that the VAC can go to.
 - g. December to March 25 there was an interaction with 81 people with only being at each event for 2-3 hours.
 - h. Reached out to the townships to further get involved.
 - i. Reaching out to police departments as well to get the word out to see if the VAC could provide information so if dealing with a veteran, they could help send them to the VAC for services if needed.

VIII. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

A. 1300 Copperfield Building Update

- a. Met with the architects. They started the roof and boilers with 3 million worth of work
- b. They are moving forward with the 3 major repairs.
- c. Interior work is going out for RFP April 1st and due April 10th
- d. There is a room for a board room which is sunken in and requires to have the concrete corrected and lifted.
- e. There will be a mental health wing to offer some privacy
- f. There will be a conference room for group counseling
- g. The basement will be where the gym will be located
- h. There will be two locker rooms

- i. Trying to get a grant to get an industrial washer and dryer in the space.
- j. Sent a request out for letters of support from community stakeholders. This is to help with the 4th floor for emergency housing
- k. Food & securities will need to get a grant to try and offset the cost
- I. Cooking will try to get a grant for an industrial kitchen
- m. November 1st or sooner will be the move in date
- n. The lease is up on 11/1 so the county is pushing for the move to happen, so the lease does not need to be renewed
- o. 2 HAVAC units are needed for the roof. Looking at 5-6 weeks to find something big enough for us to use.
- B. Financial Assistance Policy
 - a. Look at reverting to what was previously in place in the interim. Look at enhancing in 2026.
 - b. Eligibility part is what needs to be changed since there are not enough veterans that would qualify
 - c. June meeting will need to discuss the enhancement.
 - d. This is for direct aid. The separate policy would be an emergency assistance policy since this would be a separate pot of money.
 - e. Veterans are being referred to our Veterans Grants which is only \$1000 or other community entities.
 - f. There is nothing for emergency services at this point so it would need to be two separate policies.
 - g. We could call a special meeting per the open meetings act to discuss emergencies.
 - h. If the commission says that we need an emergency fund and we would need to provide the county with data to justify the ask in the budget.
 - i. Maybe extend it to be more open than just natural disasters. Set this up as a crisis fund.
- C. Update 2025 Budget Amendment Request for FTEs
 - a. Last meeting the commission approved to add additional positions. Add 1 VSO and 1 parttime driver. Said to hire the positions and will budget and cover it later. They will look in a few months to see where the budget is.
 - b. The salary is the only line item that is high.
 - c. Hoping by Friday will send an offer for VSO
 - d. Will try to move money and not request additional money from the county
